Death of George White

7 Castle Place, Southsea

George was aged 55, a stone mason. The actual time of his death was recorded, 3.30 p.m.

He died of 'An Affection of the Heart', implying heart failure, possibly due to hyperthyroidism.

His daughter Amelia, who was 'present at the death', was the informant of the death to the local Registrar.
