**Death of Jane White (nee Hunt)**

Castle Place, Southsea (Actually number 7). The actual time of death was recorded, 9.50 p.m.

Jane aged 60 died of 'Inflammation of the Chest'.

The informant was Sarah Heath: not the Sarah Heath who had married Jane's son James in 1842, (she was now Sarah White of course), but her mother Sarah Heath nee Belchambers, who must have travelled from Netley to help nurse her daughter's mother-in-law.
